## Minutes from BLSG Board Meeting, October 19, 2017

**Present:** Ben Lawton, Jeff Whiting, Kitt Shaw, Mike Blaisdell, Brad Lawes, Wayne Rausenberger, Pete Hare, Steve Kellogg

Meeting called to order by Ben Lawton at 7:01 p.m.

- 1. September minutes were approved (Moved by Lawes, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Whiting)
- Treasurer's report—Wayne Rausenberger
  - a. Equipment replacement and capital improvement checking acct. balance is \$5,792.97
  - b. General checking balance is \$47,139.39
  - c. A "product inventory rider" was added to the building equipment insurance policy on 9/22/17 at the cost of \$577 for the remainder of the policy period ((5/25/18). The state was invoiced for half of the premium (\$288.50)
  - d. Treasurer's report was approved (moved by Whiting, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Hare)
- 3. Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws—A careful review of these documents leads the board to conclude that the following steps are required in order to add a new town to the BLSG Insect Control District:
  - a. BLSG votes to add new town
  - b. New town select board votes to join
  - c. Existing member town select boards vote to add new town
- 4. Discussion on adding Pittsford to the BLSG:
  - a. BLSG needs to determine the "buy-in" cost for Pittsford. This is done by calculating the total value of the assets of the BLSG (Storage building/office, vehicles/equipment and inventory, etc.) and determining Pittsford's portion of that total value.
  - b. We will take steps over the next two weeks to determine Pittsford's buy-in cost
- 5. Discussion of the addition of Proctor to the BLSG- we will table this until next year. Proctor may be eligible for adulticide applications on a "pay for service" basis in 2018.
- 6. Budget 2018. Wayne Rausenberger led us through a line-by-line budget proposal for 2018.
- 7. District Coordinator report- Will Mathis conveyed the following report:

On Wednesday 18 October 2017, the Vermont Department of Health reported:

- One batch of mosquitoes as positive for West Nile Virus from Whiting (Addison County), collected on 10/11/17 and consisting of *Culiseta morsitans* mosquitoes.
  This was returned from a CDC light trap.
- One batch of mosquitoes as positive for West Nile Virus from Whiting (Addison County), collected on 10/11/17 and consisting of Anopheles punctipennis mosquitoes. This was returned from a resting box trap.
- One batch of mosquitoes as positive for West Nile Virus from Brandon (Rutland County), collected on 10/11/17 and consisting of *Culex territans* mosquitoes. This was returned from a resting box trap.
